**Location:** Padua, Northern Italy

**Population:** 300,000 - with a university of 70,000+

**Current Church Status:** Only 1-5 members

**Objective:** To support the evangelistic efforts of the Italian churches by leading a campus ministry center in Padua, fostering relationships within the local community and university, and creating opportunities to share the Gospel through free English conversation, events, and personal interactions.

Current Church Status: Only 1-5 members


University of Padua: no existing campus ministry center

## How God Has Already Prepared the Soil

### They Heard the Call:

2022. Spring. Christians from a neighboring church in Vicenza gathered to **pray and discuss** ways to revitalize the Padua church and reach university students.



## They Developed Ideas:

- ▶ renovate the church building to create a welcoming, functional space for students to gather, study, & hear about Jesus
- ▶ host "Let's Start Talking" volunteers to give lessons
- ▶ invite American Professors to hold seminars on certain topics

### They Took Action:

### **Build It and They Will Come**

- 1. **Raised money** and renovations began in Feb. 2024
- 2. **Renovations complete** in May 2024
- 3, 4. **Hosted first volunteers** to teach LST lessons













5, 6. Invited and hosted the first American professor seminar, around 80 people came! But there is currently no one to follow up.

## **EVANGELISTIC OPPORTUNITY**

- \* The churches in Italy have invited us to help bring their vision to life, through launching the campus ministry center using the Padua church building.
- \* As native English speakers, we can bridge connections and strengthen the current church in Padua, making it a beacon for evangelism and spiritual growth.



## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- \* Build relationships in the community
- \* Offer free English conversation taking place either in the church building or at our apartment creating opportunities to share the Gospel in a natural way.
- \* Host various events for the community in order to expose them to us and the church building.



#### EVENTS FOR IMPACT

- \* Coordinate
  American professor
  speaking events,
  advertised locally
  and on campus.
  This will attract
  students eager to
  improve their English
  while also hearing
  about topics related
  to Faith and Life.
- \* From these events, we will gather contacts for follow-up conversations and studies.



#### SERVING THE CHURCH

- \* Richard will preach and lead worship
- \* Caleigh will teach children's Bible classes, helping to nurture the next generation of believers in Padua.



#### DEVELOPING LEADERS

- \* Long-term goal to train and equip Italian leaders to eventually take over the ministry. We believe this will equip the church to continue growing and evangelizing after we leave.
- \* Richard is already working on recruiting Italians from other cities to see if they are interested in moving to Padua to join these efforts.



## OUR COMMITMENT

\* We plan to commit to this mission for at least 5 years, during which we will focus on evangelism, discipleship, and church development in Padua and beyond.

A Unique Beginning: Over 70 years ago, in the 1950s, Raffaello Paone, an ex-Catholic priest, was baptized by Howard Bybee in a nearby river.



A Heartfelt Request: Raffaello, with a burning passion, asked for someone to bring the Gospel to Padova, his hometown, where his friends and family were eager to hear it.

A Bold Response: Howard Bybee answered the call, traveling to Padova to share the message of faith, sparking the beginning of the church.

**Growth and Commitment:** As the congregation grew, Howard and others worked tirelessly, raising funds to purchase a building in the heart of Padova – Via Stefano Breda 2 – where the church has gathered ever since.

Challenges Over Time: Sadly, over the years, the congregation in Padova has dwindled, and only a handful of devoted Christians remain.





Support from Vicenza: For many years, the church in Vicenza, just an hour away, has faithfully supported Padova's congregation, preaching, worshiping, and covering building expenses.

The Struggle Today: The reality now is that only a handful of Christians remain and are having a difficult time maintaining the church building and reaching out to the community.
